Burlingame Neighborhood Tour - April 15

On this beautiful spring morning, twenty-six members of the San Diego Region of AACA gathered for a driving tour of the Burlingame neighborhood of San Diego. We started with a tailgate coffee party in North Park for socializing and admiring the classic cars. Art and Phyllis Cottee arrived in their 1965 Mustang convertible and Jack Heacock had his Mercedes 280 SL. Tom McIlravy was driving his 1973 Mustang; another Mustang was Jerry Kay's '67. Dave Gravley had his DeLorean, Al Smithson drove his "Green Bean" 1946 Mercury Coupe and John Boyd led the tour with his 1936 Custom Imperial Airflow.

This tour was Art Cottee's idea. His grandfather was one of the original homeowners in the Burlingame development, and Art has childhood memories of the times he spent there. Because of the interesting architecture of the homes in the neighborhood and his connection with the current owner of his grandfather's former house, he thought that the group would enjoy seeing the area. We did.

Our tour took us on a winding route through streets lined with red sidewalks, past homes with distinctively different architectural styles. Some were built in the Craftsman and Mission styles of the early 1900's, others with Spanish or Mediterranean influence. There was even a Swiss Chalet, and a Japonesque home to mention just a few. The original development was built primarily between 1912 and about 1929. Many of the homes in the area are listed as San Diego historical landmarks.

Art and Lori Bowen graciously welcomed us into their beautiful home, the former Cottee residence. The house has been meticulously maintained and shows the Bowen's carpentry and woodworking skills and creative influences. Of particular note is a newly tiled front entry with a mosaic reading "Cottee McCorkle 1912". After the tour of the house and Art's garage the Bowens provided a delicious lunch on their backyard patio.

We were also invited to visit the nearby home of Steve and Betty Ball. This is another notable historic house, built in the Craftsman style, and furnished in period pieces. Steve Ball has an interesting hobby of building and piloting model

paddlewheel ships, powered by miniature steam engines. He welcomed us into his shop and showed us several of the boats in detail.

Many thanks to the Bowens and Balls for their hospitality and to Art Cottee for initiating and helping with the planning of this tour. An enjoyable time was had by all the tour participants, and it was a good way to get those classic cars out on the road. Herewith, some photos of the day by various members.


