San Diego Region Financial Outlook

Over several decades, as one of the Big Three car clubs who organized the annual San Diego stadium swap meet, our club accumulated some of the profits. These profits were generated by hard work by many of our members; for example, in marking thousands of exhibitor spaces in the stadium parking lots. In reviewing our current income, expenses, and bank balance, the Board reaffirmed our intention to use these profits for attracting new members, increasing participation in our events and outings, and building enthusiasm for the antique car hobby. While maintaining a "skin in the game" practice for regular events like our summer picnics and awards banquets, the Board decided to increase subsidies of other events on a case-by-case basis. For example, the club will pay the docent fee for the upcoming Gillespie Field Aerospace Museum visit. Another example: for the contemplated group luncheon after the museum visit, a cash subsidy may be provided to each member or person attending to offset the cost of whatever lunch he/she orders. The 2025 Region Budget, to be presented for approval at our February meeting, will provide for our revised spending plan. It is the Board's hope that the changes will indeed lead to increased participation and enthusiasm in our activities and for the hobby.

The Freshman is a 1925 American silent comedy film that tells the story of a college freshman trying to become popular by joining the school football team. It remains one of Lloyd's most successful and enduring films. Train station scenes were filmed at the Southern Pacific Railroad depot at Ontario, California, with a four-car train set and locomotive provided by the railroad and standing on a siding adjacent to the station. Some shots were also made in the park across the street from the depot. Some 80 cast and crew were involved at this location. Exteriors were filmed near the USC campus in Los Angeles. The game sequence was shot on the field at the Rose Bowl, and the crowd scenes were shot at halftime at California Memorial Stadium during the November 1924 Big Game between UC Berkeley and Stanford University. An Ode to Antique Automobiles



100 Years on the Lincoln Highway


