
This Region tour will be an interesting drive to the Deer Park Winery on Saturday, April 5, to see several dozen older cars (nearly all convertibles from the 1940s, 50s, and 60s), taste some wine, and enjoy conversations with fellow car enthusiasts. The entry fee is \$12 (seniors). There is on-site parking for about 40 vehicles and a large covered patio with some seating. Bring your own folding chairs (just to be sure) and lunch or sandwiches. We can buy snacks & beverages on site. I suggest arriving at about 11:00 am. The car collection includes around 100 rare cars, including a 1929 Pierce Arrow Roadster, a 1928 Franklin sedan, a 53 Cadillac Eldorado, a 53 Oldsmobile Fiesta, a 1903 Curved-dash Oldsmobile, and a 59 Cadillac Eldorado.

If you would like to participate in a club caravan to the winery, please be at the Target parking lot in Mission Valley (11288 Camino del Rio N, San Diego 92108) by 9:30 for a 10:00 am departure. It's a 50-minute drive up 15, about 37 miles. Deer Park is located on Old Hwy 395 just north of Lawrence Welk Village. The Deer Park address is 29013 Champagne Blvd., Escondido 92026. Allow at least 90 minutes if you use the route that avoids freeways — leave Mission Valley by 9:30.

Since Lynne and I live in the north county, we will meet you at Deer Park. Years ago, I led a similar tour that stayed mostly off the freeway parallel to I-15. Apple Maps, and no doubt Google Maps, can draw such a route. Apple's is 46 miles instead of 37, and it takes an estimated hour and a half.





