### Carlsbad Museum




### **Art Cottee**

Then Al would add that the whole country was celebrating with him for his birthday. Nick was a past president, serving our club in 1984. He had many health issues in the last few years and will be missed.

### From David Felderstein, President, Airflow Club of America

Nicholas M. Fintzelberg, age 91, passed away on August 7, 2025. A lifelong auto enthusiast, Nick was one of the founders of the Horseless Carriage Club of America, created the San Diego Region of the Classic Car Club of America (CCCA), and served with distinction as the CCCA President. He was involved with the AACA and San Diego Region for many years as well. Nick owned a beautiful black 1934 Chrysler CU Airflow sedan and many other cars.



Active in San Diego civic affairs, in the 1960's Nick and his father Milton spearheaded the creation of Old Town San

Diego State Park, which included the restoration of the historic Mission San Diego. His personal passion resulted in the creation of an 8-acre site for new "street" where 7 magnificent historic San Diego Victorian homes that had been slated for demolition were beautifully relocated for future generations to enjoy. Another of Nick's lasting contributions was to partner with well-known auto enthusiast Ralph Marano to expand CCCA Full Classic status for Airflow cars from just a handful of very long wheelbase cars to all 128" wheelbase cars (CV, C2, C10, C11, and C17) in 2014.

Nick and David Felderstein drove David's '35 Airflow Imperial on a CCCA "CARavan" in Western Canada in 2019. He attended several of the Airflow Club National Meets and many ACA Western Region events, as well as being an active participant of the San Diego Region AACA monthly meetings and outings. He was a fine man, an important figure in our car hobby, and will be missed.
