The Incomparable Imperial

The term Imperial has been synonymous with Chrysler luxury since 1926. However, beginning in 1955, the Chrysler took the name one step further, making it an independent marque, the Imperial Division of Chrysler Corporation. Like Cadillac for GM and later Continental for Ford, Imperial represented Chrysler's most luxurious vehicles. Virgil Exner introduced his all-new design, the "Forward Look," across the Chrysler divisions beginning in 1955. While Imperial shared its body



shell and platform with Chrysler's other big cars, Imperials were distinguished by a four-inch longer wheelbase offering additional legroom, as well as gunsight taillights and an egg crate front grille. The 1955 lineup included this sedan, the Crown Imperial 8-Passenger Sedan, a limousine, and the "Newport" two-door hardtop. This Imperial is a mostly original car. It is powered by a factory-installed 331 cubic-inch Hemi engine that has never been rebuilt. The low mileage car was never far from home before its trip to the Museum. It was ordered new by the Postmaster/Station Master of the Bryn Athyn Post Office in Montgomery County, Pa. Its full leather interior in medium and dark gray is extremely uncommon. The car came standard with power-assisted brakes and steering. The optional heater/defroster added \$82 to the car's total sale price of \$5,122.33. The original invoice shows the buyer received a \$1,400 trade-in credit for a '50 Chrysler Sedan. Hank Halloman 20-minute discussion of this car: https://youtu.be/NQ5AcKIOOEI

From Art Cottee: Larry was one of the kindest and thoughtful people that we

have ever known. Never a complaint and always friendly, he added so much to our club. We looked forward to any tour that he and Paula had arranged. If there was any problem that needed to be addressed, he was there to help. The club will greatly miss his presence. Phyllis and I will miss his friendship. Paula and Larry were the perfect couple.

From Al Smithson: Larry was always cheerful even when he was feeling poorly and maybe in pain. As a former President of the San Diego Region, Larry always sought consensus and common ground among differing opinions. Larry and Paula were a joy to be around and always brightened our day. We will truly miss you, Larry.







From Daryl and Betty Holmes: It has been our pleasure and honor to call Larry Okey our friend for over 20 years. He was our hero, even though he was in immense pain with his arthritis, he never complained and never refused to help out when he saw a need. He volunteered at the Automobile Museum library for many years, also at The Fireman's Museum, and he volunteered his time at the hospital as well. We saw him many times marking spaces for the car swap meet and other national events never showing he was hurting.

Paula was always at his side. Larry was always willing to donate some of his handy woodwork for club projects, he will be missed not only by us but by everyone whose lives he touched.

From Jack Heacock: I met Larry years ago when they used to have the monthly car show and swap meet at the stadium (not the Big 3). I had a 1955 Chevy Belair at the show and Larry came up and introduced himself and we chatted for a while and before leaving he invited me to attend the club's monthly meeting when it was at the church near 30th and University. Before the meeting began, Daryl Holmes was pounding away on the piano, and when guests were introduced Larry stood up and asked me to say a few words about my car interests. Thru the years we always found a few minutes to converse, and he later invited me to be a library docent at the San Diego Auto Museum assisting him in the library. Whenever I bought a new (old) car he helped me find brochures, manuals and articles relating to my newest edition. I don't remember anyone who could recognize our cars better than Larry. I'm sure we all will miss him and I hope he gets a chance to look down upon us.

From Norma Almanza:

Larry welcomed me and Aryana, my granddaughter to the annual marking of stalls for the Big Three Swap meet. She was barely walking and still treasures the little wooden car that Larry bestowed on children. That is how I will remember Larry.

From Mark Richards: I'll always remember the brightly colored little wooden cars that Larry made to give to kids at carshows. He'd say that when he opened the box that he kept them in "the kids eyes would just light up". As a newcomer to San Diego, it was always good to see that red and white Buick at a car show event, because then I knew I had a friend there. We shared some good times sitting in lawn chairs in the shade, swapping stories.
