Two Phaetons

Al Smithson notes:

Two Phaetons - side by side - in Mark's garage - but worlds apart!!! Now together in the San Diego Region thanks to Barbara Foley and Al Smithson. Al's 1936 Ford joins Barbara's 1937 La Salle. Ed. note: "Phaeton", originally a kind of horse carriage, is usually a four-door car with a folding top. And usually without fixed side windows. They were also called touring cars. The word has three syllables and is properly pronounced "fay'-a-ton", but it's not uncommon to hear people – even famous car people – saying "fay'-ton."

It's a factory custom Imperial with a 10-inch stretch. There is one similar car in Australia, but no others are known to the Airflow Club. The car was ugly and needed everything, but its "1 of 2" rarity convinced us. Failing to find anyone else to take it on, we partnered to save the car, completing the process in early 2022. Since then, the car has spent several months in the San Diego Auto Museum and has been shown (and won top awards) at several national shows including AACA, Classic Car Club of America, and The Airflow Club. Jon and I agree it's time to move it along, and we'd like to recover *some* of the money we spent on it. It's currently listed on Hemmings as a best-offer sale.
